##### **5.2 Recognition of Student Board Member Representatives**

Deputy Superintendent Van Schaack asked President Craig Bueno to honor and recognize our student Board representatives Elise Davies and Emily Wheeler. President Bueno thanked the student Board members for their dedication, commitment, hard work and contribution at each meeting. He stated that each of these young women are talented speakers, as representatives of their peers, and represent the voices of our young generation. He noted that they are accomplished students, and both have been on the Honor Roll throughout high school, have participated in Leadership, and excelled in Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. President Bueno presented Elise and Emily with a plaque as a token of appreciation.

##### **5.3 Recognition of Livermore High School IT Specialist, Kevin Peterson**

Deputy Superintendent Van Schaack introduced Helen Gladden, the very proud principal of Livermore High School, who recognized and honored IT Specialist Kevin Peterson. Mrs. Gladden stated that Mr. Peterson's efforts have been paramount to the success of Livermore High School with the ever-changing

needs and transitions from on-site learning to distance learning to hybrid learning and back this year to full onsite learning. Kevin has consistently worked behind the scenes to ensure that students and teachers had the technology tools they needed to access instruction. Mrs. Gladden remarked that Kevin is the definition of humble and kind and thanked him for all he has done and continues to do to support Livermore High School.

## 14.0 BOARD MEMBER REPORTS AND REQUESTS

Trustee Kristie Wang thanked the Livermore Community for supporting and passing Measure A. In addition, she recognized and thanked the many volunteers who served on the Committee for Measure A. She remarked that it was the season of awards and how nice it had been to visit sites and award ceremonies recognizing scholars, athletes, musicians, as well as teachers and staff. She also noted that it was especially thrilling to attend the Pedrozzi Young Scholars Awards. Trustee Wang commented that she was very excited about the Youth Civic Engagement Program called Project Citizen, and noted that several teachers have already implemented this program. She called attention to the 8th grade Core team from Christensen Middle School who attended the Training Institute last summer and implemented the program this year. She is grateful that these teachers were willing to take on something extra and acknowledged them for their hard work.

Trustee Yanira Guzmán, reported that it had given her much joy to attend the celebration events. She commented that she had attended several events including: the Harlem Wizards game, Years of Service Awards for Jackson and Joe Michell K-8, and the Livermore Management Association Awards Ceremony. Trustee Guzmán closed her remarks as she expressed appreciation to teachers and staff for working so hard during a most difficult year.

He noted that throughout the pandemic, it was apparent that our schools are central to our community. He observed that our District supported our community through our Child Nutrition Department serving meals, psychologists serving students, and our staff co-hosting and coordinating vaccination clinics. He noted that we maintained budgets, received positive reports, hiring was top notch, and our Bond Program was ahead of schedule and under budget. President Bueno commented that all of these things were a direct reflection of the work of our Superintendent's Cabinet. He also remarked that he looks forward to several upcoming awards events, including the Olympian Scholarship Awards. He offered a special thanks to our community for supporting Measure A and noted that this will directly

impact the academic achievement of our students. President Bueno closed his remarks by thanking Deputy Superintendent Van Schaack for stepping in to lead the meeting in the absence of Dr. Bowers.

**15.0 SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT**

In Dr. Bowers absence due to illness, Deputy Superintendent Chris Van Schaack reported that Dr. Bowers would have been thrilled to see the displays of student excellence in the meeting. He remarked that Dr. Bowers is looking forward to feeling better to enjoy the next few weeks of celebrating the accomplishments of our students. He noted that the next Regular Board meeting would be post-graduation.

**16.0 ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business before the Board, President Bueno adjourned the Meeting at 10:09 P.M.
