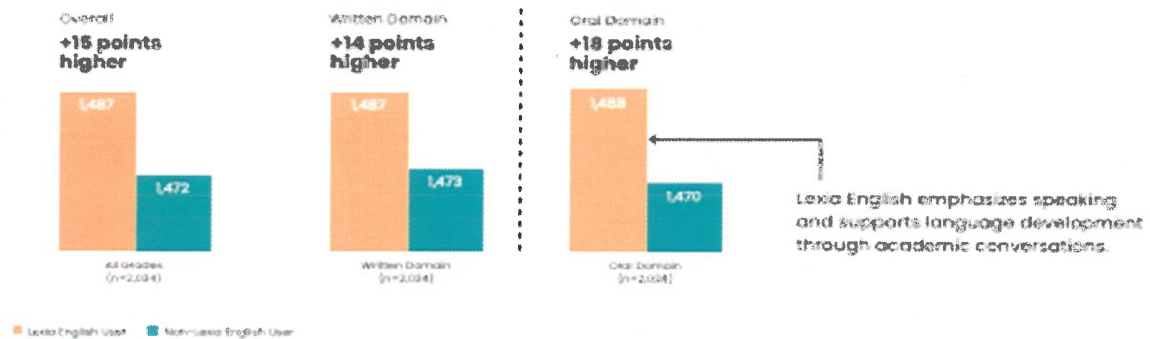

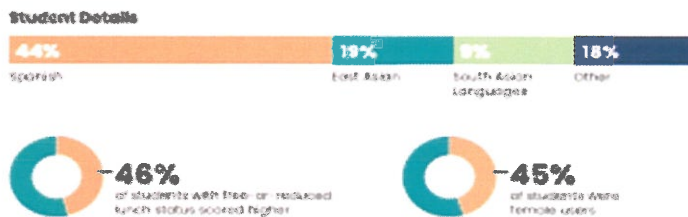
Lexia English Initial Findings on 2021 ELPAC Scores

Higher scores with Lexia English use



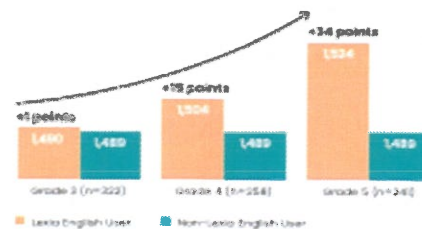
Higher Scores for Every Student

Instructional Content

Lexia English provides Emergent Bilingual students with opportunities for extensive speaking and listening practice that spans the curriculum and includes embedded grammar and academic vocabulary learning. This helps students expand their academic vocabulary while encouraging them to apply their learning in different subject areas.

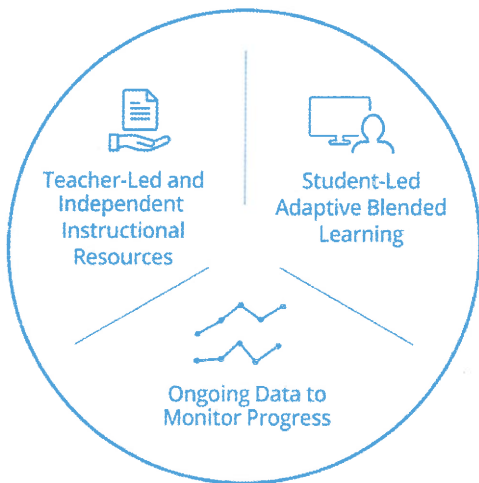
- **Oral Language & Speaking**—Lexia English allows for personalized interactions and conversations through purposeful repetition, offering students ample opportunities to practice in a safe and non-judgmental environment. Language Frames are introduced via the format: I do, We do, You do. The “I do” portion is done by the character who introduces the language frame. Purposeful repetition is provided, as the learner goes on to the next step of saying the language frame on their own. Finally, the scaffolds are removed, and the learner is completely responsible for engaging in conversations with the character on the screen. During every phase of the exchange, the learner receives instant corrective feedback based on the information the Speech Recognition Engine is capturing.
- **Oral Language & Listening**—Lexia English offers learners an opportunity to engage in listening activities that are based on modern media, such as podcasts, with content that is both appealing and related to subject matter. Learners listen to passages for a specific set of comprehension strategies and skills, along with grammar-focused questions. The mixture of question types helps learners attune to language and become accustomed to listening to both the overall meaning and the sentence structure of the passage. During the listening process, if a learner indicates that he/she needs assistance with comprehension, he/she is directed to a branching session where they receive further instruction in the listening or grammar skills that is being taught.
- **Grammar**—Lexia English aims to help Emergent Bilinguals understand how to construct meaningful sentences within academic content. The lessons include embedded, explicit, scaffolded grammar instruction that enables users to have conversations about different academic topics. Language Frames provide learners with portable language that can be used in a variety of school settings. The language frames help learners make sense of—and properly use— grammatical conventions in conversation and academic discussion that go beyond foundational sentence-starters. The language frames in Lexia English are carefully crafted to support a learner while leading to a gradual release in addition to exposing learners to a variety of contexts and subject matter topics, and with varying levels of complexity.

Instructional Design

Lexia English is designed to offer ‘standard’ and scaffolded instruction: students that provide the right answer move on to the next exercise. In each unit, a student must demonstrate proficiency in order to progress. When two errors are made, the program provides scaffolded support and instruction on the targeted grammar skill being addressed. This explicit instruction is only provided when a student struggles with a particular skill. Students who demonstrate mastery can quickly move through units and onto more advanced proficiency levels.

This 2-step instructional branching ensures individualized learning and instruction for every student.

1. The **Standard Step** provides an independent task that allows students to display their knowledge of the targeted grammar skill. If one error is made, or if the student answers the step correctly, they move on to the next Standard Step. If the student makes two errors, they move to the Instruction Step.
2. The **Instruction Step** (scaffolded instruction) explicitly teaches the targeted grammar skill through a series of scaffolded tasks. When the student successfully completes this step, he/she progresses to the next Standard Step.



Lexia English provides educators with continuous progress-monitoring, as well as offline resources that empower the prioritization and targeted instruction required to meet the individual needs of all students. The embedded assessment tool, Assessment Without Testing®, offers real-time progress-monitoring of student performance on specific areas of language proficiency, providing educators with actionable data to support student achievement in a personalized way. Educators can easily keep track of students’ performance without waiting for standardized testing results.

Program Research

Lexia English is built upon research supporting best practices around language learning and development (Theories on Foreign and Second-Language Learning). The following theories played an important role in the creation and development of the program.

Natural Approach (Krashen): Lexia English acquires language by understanding what students hear (Comprehensible Input). In order for language acquisition to happen, anxiety needs to be reduced.

- 1. Interaction Hypothesis (Long, et al.):** The development of language is promoted by face-to-face interactions—in order to learn a language, you must speak the language.
- 2. Output Hypothesis (Swain, et al.):** Learning takes place when speakers reflect on how they actually engage in conversation.
- 3. Corrective Feedback (Tedick/Gotari):** The following types of feedback can be used to promote students' reflection as they engage in conversation:
 - Explicit correction
 - Recast
 - Clarification request
 - Metalinguistic clues
 - Elicitation
 - Repetition
- 4. Functions of Language (Halliday):** There are seven different functions/stages to how children use language:
 - Instrumental
 - Regulatory
 - Interactional
 - Personal
 - Heuristic
 - Imaginative
 - Representational.

The Neuroscience Research behind Lexia English

How People Learn (published by the United States National Academy of Sciences' National Academies Press) is an education psychology book that brought together scientists and researchers from backgrounds such as cognitive science, education, and psychology to synthesize the knowledge of how people learn and leverage this in practical ways for the classroom.

This book identified three ways in which people learn that influenced the program’s curriculum:

1. **Preconceived Notions (Background Knowledge)** Students come to class with ideas about how the world works that may be factual or inaccurate. If students do not have an opportunity to compare what they used to think with new information, the research suggests that they will revert to their old thinking once the “test” has been taken.
2. **Deep Foundation of Factual Knowledge (Skills such as Multiplication and Phonics)** Students deepen their understanding of disciplinary skills and content knowledge through frequent, meaningful exposure that helps develop their competence in the domain.
3. **Metacognitive talk/ self-talk (Ability to Verbalize Thinking as Learning)** Students monitor their thinking, understand when new information is being learned, and compare what is being learned to what they already know.
