Thank you for continuing to put meetings on Zoom! If meetings were held in person, I would not be able to attend because my husband is recovering from a heart infection and surgery replacing two heart valves.

Thank you also for requiring students, faculty, and staff to wear masks and social distance! When we protect the health of our schools, we protect the health of our community. Thank you in addition, for reopening schools! Let's keep our schools open by protecting student and staff health and thus protecting our community, too.

Furthermore, I request that you continue to administer vaccinations to students, and I encourage you to establish vaccine requirements as soon as feasible. My daughter, who lives with us, teaches instrumental music to community students. If she contracts COVID-19 from a student, she will put her father at risk. As a heart patient, he is vulnerable to COVID-19. The risk of COVID-19 is much, much greater than the risk of taking a vaccine. Please continue to protect the health of us all!

Vaccinations for school children for polio, whooping cough, measles, etc., have been successful and in existence since 1850 and established as a student requirement in all states since 1977. I remember getting a polio vaccine to attend school when I was young. Vaccinations for COVID-19 is a matter of public health, not simply personal rights.
