Emergency item Brown act remove masks

Comments *

I would like to insist and demand you make this an emergency item to remove the masks as provided in the Brown Act (Government Code 54956).

Why the urgency?

Two years in, and the research literature is now becoming increasingly clear: face masks are ineffective against airborne viruses. The Brownstone Institute has produced a compilation of 167 comparative studies and articles attesting to the harm and ineffectiveness of compulsory masking.

So the primary question we now face is as follows: Why would we continue forcing students, our lowest at-risk group, to remain masked at schools when we know children do not readily acquire SARS-CoV-2 (very low risk), spread it to other children or teachers, or endanger parents or others at home. Moreover, in the rare cases where a child contracts Covid virus, they have a 99.995 percent chance of survival.

California has seen a 65% drop in coronavirus cases. Dr. Jeanne Noble, Director of COVID-19 response for the UCSF Emergency Department at the University of California, San Francisco who states "Kids don't need to be masked. Full stop. They have minuscule risk of serious illness or death from COVID."
